3. Discovery in Research ( 20 votes) - not selected to create a definition
4. Fun (17 votes) - Positive interactions with student and colleagues that make you want to go to work. Work must be pleasurable
5. Respect and Integrity (16 votes): Requires humility engagement curiosity about others and an open mind. Earn trust through transparency in decisions and research, values based decision making (consistent). Respect diverse strengths and contributions, which equals pride in and appreciation of.
6. Collegiality/Community ( 16 votes): A group with a shared vision and ideals, and with mutual respect
7. Collaboration (11 votes): Working together across disciplines with a common purpose

i. The Provost has 3 million in permanent funds that is to be used for graduate student recruitment by providing RA's for departments.

iv. Ken and David Catling have given feedback to the college that the method of RA distribution does not adequately account for ESS Ph.D. graduation rates.
