- Research faculty: (Harold) seismo/geodesy, 7 applicants and they have a recommendation for proceeding
- Planetary (David Catling), 6 applications, no recommendation yet.

• GeoClub Spring Break Trip (Stone)

- GeoClub spring break trip: Grand Canyon. In need of a faculty member to accompany them. Any volunteers? Would be great to have someone there who knows the geology and can talk to them about it. Department will fund a graduate student to accompany the group.
- About 10-12 students. After exam week, spring break. Will go for 6-7 days.

Admissions (Buick)

- Application deadline was midnight January 5. ~180 applications in total.
- Main areas of interest: 29 astro, 24 planetary, 20 geomorph, 14 petrology/min/geochem, 13 climate/paleoclimate.

 More applications for the masters program than usual - 40 (research program). No MESSAGe applications this year; some of the people applying to the research program would have applied to MESSAGe.

• Admissions - Open House Discussion

- General feeling from faculty and staff is that bringing students in individually worked well last year, allowing for more flexibility for students who would not have been able to make it to an official open house. Travel constraints can make it difficult to get everyone here at the same time.
- General feeling from graduate students was the opposite. They want one open house. The approach last year felt disorganized with not one, but several smaller open houses. The graduate students under the advisors bringing in students felt unprepared, that they did not have enough time planning last minute logistics, and that spreading these activities over several weeks was a lot more work with a significant burden placed on individual graduate students.

• Senate (Stone)

- The senate spent a great deal of time trying to find out dispute resolution procedures since winter quarter last year. Still not at the end of it. Will generate legislation at some point. Subcommittee of the senate is meeting to craft procedures used to codify procedures (conflict resolution) involving disciplinary actions against faculty, up until now is in the hands of the chair, with not a lot of oversight. Generated a HUGE amount of discussion. Long and complicated procedure is being proposed.
